To Whom It May Concern:

The Palmetto Clean Fuels Coalition (PCF) is once again pleased to submit a recommendation to the Volkswagen Group of America's Zero Emission Vehicle (ZEV) team. PCF is one of only 100 designated U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Clean Cities coalitions, made up of volunteer public and private stakeholders. PCF promotes the advancement of alternative fuels, advanced vehicle technologies, and clean transportation.

While Palmetto Clean Fuels stands behind its Cycle 1 recommendations for increased connectivity between and within major metropolitan areas (Attachment A), it also realizes the importance of increasing electric vehicle (EV) infrastructure and awareness within South Carolina. Recent projections indicate EVs will become comparable in price to their internal-combustion counterparts¹ by 2022, making it essential to increase public awareness of EVs and increase infrastructure. South Carolina currently lacks a strong network of charging stations. PCF urges Electrify America to prioritize the implementation of EV awareness recommendations from the Plug in SC plan. PCF would also like to emphasize the importance of infrastructure along established Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) alternative fuel vehicle (AFV) corridors, in highly trafficked locations, and at state fleet management fueling sites.

Education and Awareness Campaign: Plug in SC

PCF has finalized its multi-year Plug in SC plan² to promote EVs and establish recommendations for strategically placed EV infrastructure. The Plug in SC plan, which includes research, analysis, and a state-wide marketing campaign, is the foundation for PCF's recommendations to Electrify America.

Sales of EVs in South Carolina currently lag when compared to adjacent states. According to the National Renewable Energy Laboratory and IHS Automotive, there are only 1.3 - 2.0 registered EVs per 10,000 residents in South Carolina.³ While this is a disappointing statistic, it also

indicates an opportunity to increase EV sales in a state that holds significant potential for economic development, tourism, and growth.

While visiting specific EV sites, PCF noticed that markings and signage varied greatly, causing confusion and often causing the stations to be overlooked. The Plug in SC plan recommends implementing standardized signage and pavement markings to educate drivers and promote already available EV charging stations.

According to the plan, each parking space should be equipped with the “Electric Vehicle Charging Symbol” D9-11b and the “No Parking Except Electric Vehicles” R7-111 signs. In addition, the spot should be outlined with 4” to 6” wide green stripes along both sides. For greater visibility, the Plug in SC Logo can be placed in the center of the EV charging space. See Attachment B for a turn-key guide on implementing signage recommendations.

The estimated cost to implement this standardized signage across the state at existing EV charging stations is roughly \$80,000. See table below for a complete cost estimate of equipment and fees by charging level.

According to the DOE Alternative Fuels Data Center (AFDC) there are currently 165 non-Tesla EV charging stations in South Carolina. This equates to 328 charging ports (see table above). The cost estimates in the table above include the paint costs, contracting fees for labor, and recommended signage for each of the 328 ports. To increase awareness of EVs in South Carolina, PCF recommends that Electrify America consider supporting the Plug in SC initiative with funding necessary to carry out the cost to implement consistent pavement markings and signage as indicated. These efforts and funding should first target existing EV charging stations in South Carolina. At the very least, PCF urges Electrify America to consider this pavement marking and signage at any future charging locations installed by Electrify America in the State.

State Fleet Public Fueling Sites

South Carolina State Fleet Management (SFM) is a “covered fleet” subject to the Energy Policy Act of 1992 (EPAct) vehicle acquisition requirements. SFM and other covered fleets nation-wide are required to promote AFVs by ensuring at least 75% of its annual light duty vehicles acquisitions can utilize an EPAct defined alternative fuel.⁵ In 2016, SFM had 15,245 business usage vehicles within the state fleet. These fleet vehicles represent a unique opportunity to advance AFVs. EVs are well suited for fleets with fixed route applications, shorter trips, and vehicles that centrally fuel.

Traditionally SFM has relied on the availability of flex-fuel vehicles to comply with EPAct requirements. However, flex-fuel vehicles have become increasingly more difficult to procure via state contract for specific vehicle needs. Some makes and models are no longer available and ethanol fuel is increasingly more difficult to find. With the decreasing availability of flex-fuel vehicles, SFM will have to consider other AFVs. Apart from one Nissan Leaf in its fleet, no other EVs are owned by SFM.

PCF, in working to promote the Clean Cities mission, conducted a state fleet survey as part of the implementation of the State Energy Plan.⁶ This survey⁷ indicated that the largest barrier to the purchase of AFVs is inadequate or expensive infrastructure. Providing infrastructure at state fleet refueling locations could provide public charging availability, as well as charging for the state fleet. While there are 92 state-owned fueling locations, PCF recommends that Electrify

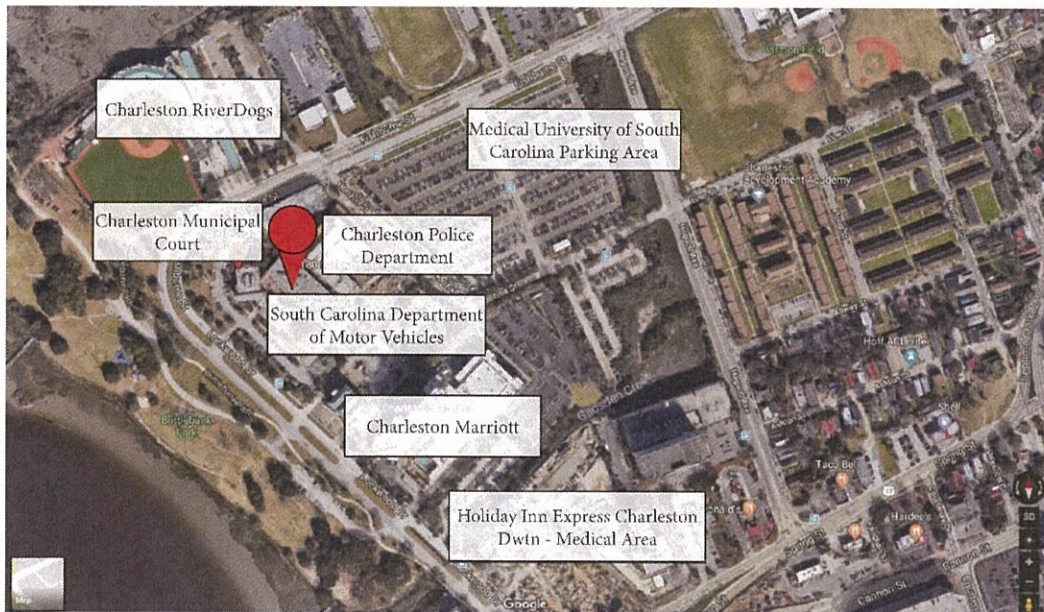
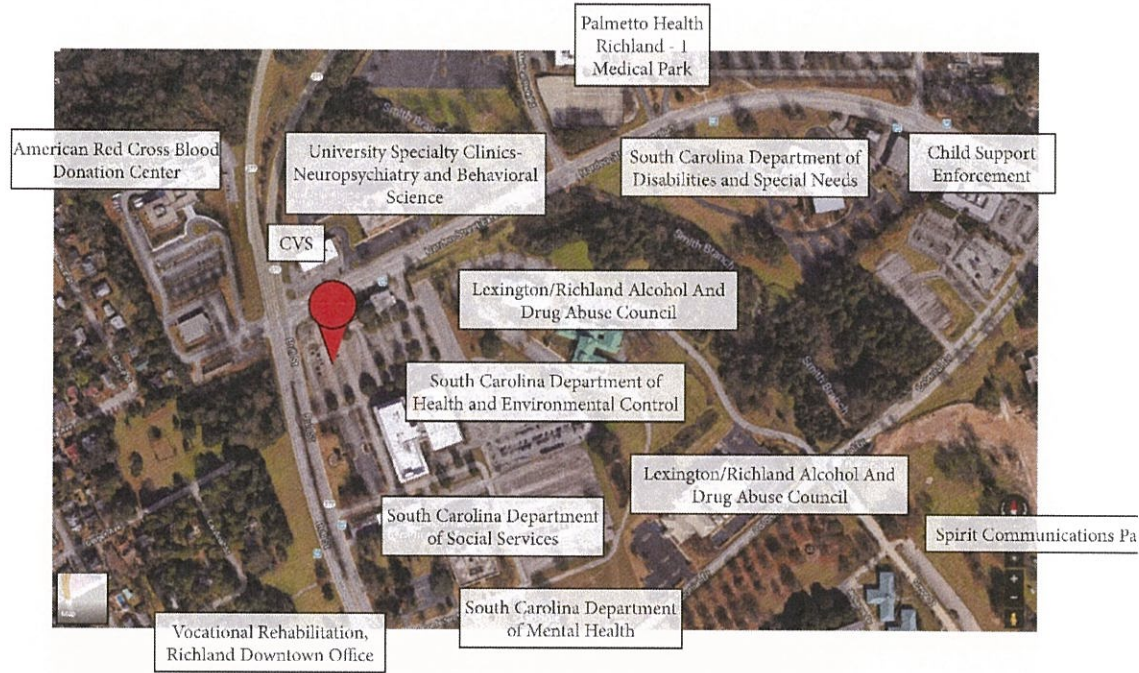

America consider investing in EV charging stations at locations that would support SFM and provide public access to EV charging infrastructure. For a full list of SFM fueling sites, see Attachment C. PCF offers two ideal locations for consideration that are also adjacent to large state agencies, schools/universities, and recreational venues. These locations are also both within 3 miles of major interstates, segments of which have been designated as EV corridors by the FHWA. The maps below provide a basis for this recommendation. Specific employment

data, visitor information, and transportation data can be obtained to further support this recommendation.

High Volume Traffic Locations and Destinations

PCF believes that additional EV infrastructure should be placed at publicly available and frequently visited locations including:

- airports,
- industrial facilities,
- shopping centers,
- hospitals,
- popular tourist attractions, and
- state parks.

For a full list of strategic site locations, see Attachment D.

Due to the typical length of time spent at these locations, PCF believes these installations should include level 2 and fast charging infrastructure. Higher priority should be given to locations that would reinforce and extend already established AFV corridors.⁸

PCF is excited about this potential opportunity and would appreciate working with the Electrify America team to increase EV awareness and promote EV infrastructure in South Carolina. PCF remains committed to providing additional data related to employment, tourism and transportation as necessary to support Electrify America's efforts to invest in South Carolina. RE: *Electrify America: Volkswagen ZEV Settlement Funds*

To Whom It May Concern:

The Palmetto Clean Fuels Coalition (PCF) is pleased to submit these comments to Volkswagen Group of America's Zero Emission Vehicle (ZEV) infrastructure and awareness campaign. We recognize the campaign's interest in focusing on major metropolitan areas, but we would like to strongly encourage you to consider mobility *between*, as well as within, those areas. Our research has identified significant gaps in electric vehicle (EV) infrastructure coverage along major transportation corridors within our state. These occur on I-85 which connects Charlotte and Atlanta, along I-95 which connects major metropolitan areas in the northeast to Florida, and along I-77 which links the Midwest to the south via I-85 or I-95.

The PCF is one of only a 100 designated U.S. Department of Energy's Clean Cities coalitions made up of volunteer public and private stakeholders aimed at promoting alternative fuels, advanced vehicle technology, and clean transportation. For more about PCF and our membership, please visit: www.palmettocleanfuels.org.

While the PCF is still finalizing its own multi-year "Plug In SC" campaign¹ to promote EV and infrastructure, we believe the "Plug In SC" plan (to include research, analysis, and a state-wide marketing campaign) sets out the foundation for our recommendations. This "Plug in SC" plan will ultimately include recommendations to further develop an extensive state-wide network to promote electric vehicles adoption and deployment. However, given the timing request for this proposal, PCF would like to offer the following recommendations as a potential starting point for Electrify America to consider.

Using several mapping tools, one of which was developed by students enrolled in the University of South Carolina, PCF has analyzed which areas of the State are currently underserved, the distance between current infrastructure, and which roadways connect the major metropolitan areas both within and State and the throughout the US (to correspond with the recently announced Federal Highway Administration's AFV Corridor designations).² Ultimately these recommendations highlight where potential EV infrastructure will have the most benefit.

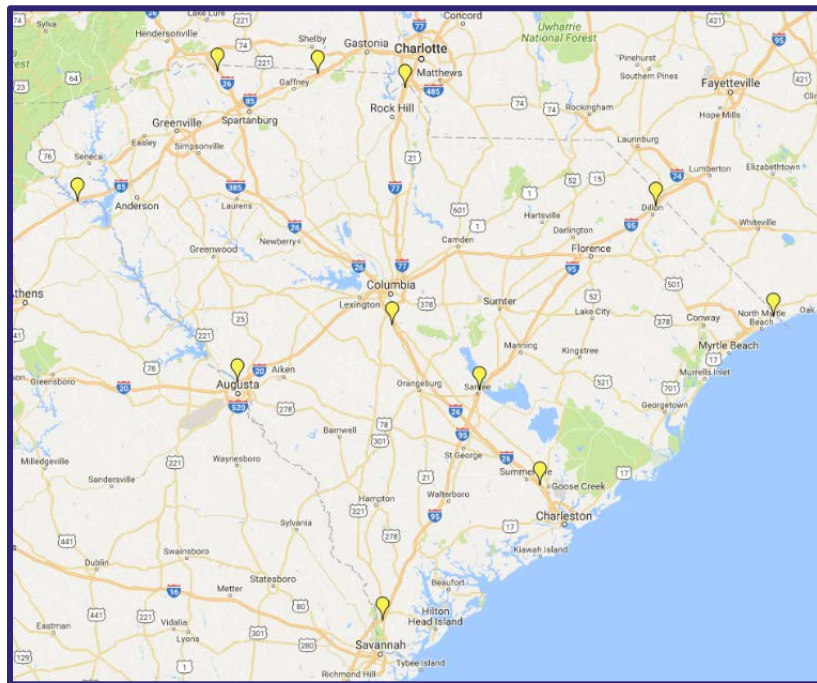
PCF believes that EV infrastructure should be placed first at publicly available locations (initially at strategic SC Department of Transportation designated Welcome Centers and Rest Areas) along the most frequently used corridors (see table below). Due to the typical length of time spent at these locations, we believe these installations should include fast charging infrastructure. Electrify America would have the

PAVEMENT MARKINGS AND PARKING SIGNAGE QUICK GUIDE

This guide should help to implement recommendations made in the Plug in SC plan, formed by the Palmetto Clean Fuels (PCF) coalition.

Any signs posted in a public right of way must be supported by local ordinances that specify any time limits, penalties, and definitions. Any signs posted in the public right of way must meet MUTCD requirements, as well as other relevant local specifications, such as height requirements. Private parking areas that are not open to the public are not required to meet MUTCD signage requirements. However, organizations that provide charging in private areas may find that consistency with the standards helps all drivers understand and recognize charging station signage. If the designaged space is contained within a parking structure or garage, PCF recommends external signage to indicate specific locations of charging spaces.

SIGNAGE SPECIFICATIONS



The “Electric Vehicle Charging Symbol” (D9-11b) should be mounted above the regulatory sign, and be 12” x 12” to match the width.



Posted in a visible location around the parking space, the “No Parking Except Electric Vehicles” (R7-111) regulatory sign should be 12” wide x 18” tall.”

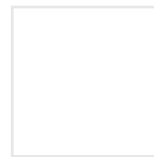

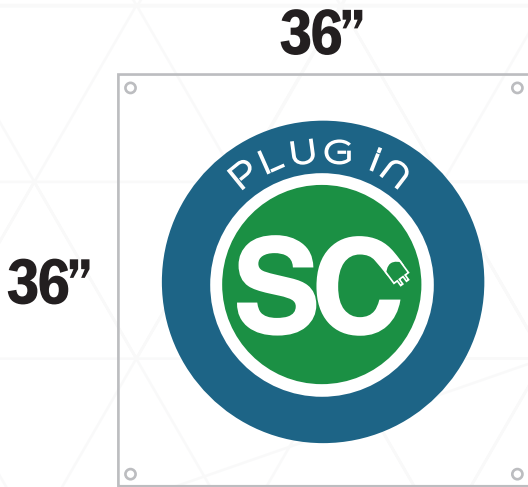


PAVEMENT MARKINGS

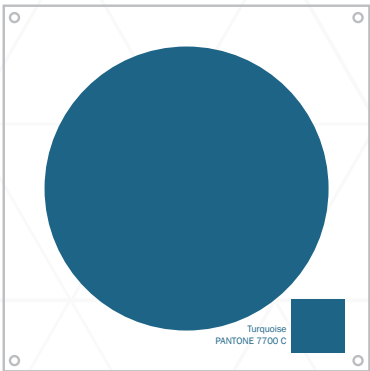
PLUG IN SC LOGO STENCIL

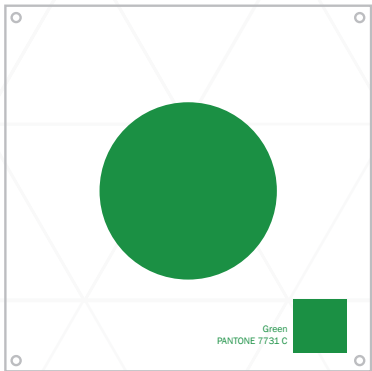
Step 1

Apply Layer 1 stencil and paint turquoise base.



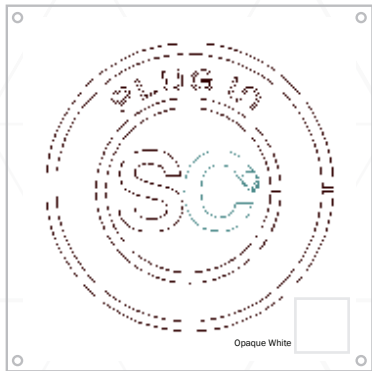
Step 2
